The second half of the year is a great opportunity to revisit goals set at the beginning of the school year with your child and discussing how they have progressed thus far. With the winter doldrums in full effect, this is also a good time to remind your children about his/her responsibilities as a student, helping them reestablish routines coming off an extended break from school. Encouraging them to study daily, read for enjoyment, review

math facts, and keeping homework folders organized are a few small examples of how you can help your child be successful in school. As we continue to strive for academic excellence and build upon the strong foundation that the home and school have established, it is imperative that we empower students to be responsible for their own actions so that they may develop into responsible, lifelong learners.


I want to take this opportunity to thank those parents who abide by the safety rules and procedures that we have established over the years regarding student arrival. Student arrival on East Lake Avenue although better than in the past, remains a concern and a hot topic on social media (according to my sources). I respectfully ask that parents continue to pull forward and utilize the entire drop-off area. Additionally, if you must get out of the car to let your child out, please do not do so in the drop off area. This will greatly improve traffic flow and make student arrival quicker and safer. I ask that you please share this information with whom-ever is responsible for transporting your child to school.

In addition to student arrival, dismissal is just as important. East Lake School currently has 511 students who need to get home

safely every day. That means that there can be as many as 511 different plans each day. You can help us manage these plans by keeping a daily pick up routine with your children. It is always beneficial to have a familiar routine so your child can become more confident, independent, and most importantly, safe as they navigate the campus after school. Having pre-arranged plans with a neighbor or family member to pick up your children in the event you are delayed or unable to get to the school for pick up is most helpful. Of course, any time the daily routine is changed, please inform the main office especially if it involves a primary aged student. Please remind your child that if they do not see you or their designated pick up person that they should go back into the building and report to the main office. Let's continue to work together to keep all children safe.

Finally, if you ever have any questions or concerns about any aspect of your child's education, feel free to contact me or Mrs. Velte. We welcome your inquiries. Have a wonderful remainder of the school year!
